Towards project management 4.0 – general project management methodology

Project management 4.0 is a commissioned education which gives you a theoretical and practical basis for handling all types of projects. The unique feature is how your capabilities grows in an agile way during the course and is individually adapted for you and your organization. As a participant, you get access to knowledge directly from the industry.

TARGET GROUP

Present and future project workers in any project role or type of project wanting to build capability for project-oriented work by consolidating, upgrading and expanding their knowledge and skills in combination with supporting behaviour. This course is equally adapted to private as well as public sector.

You may equally well benefit from this course regardless if you already have practical experience of project management but want to gain also a more solid theoretical foundation and insight into the newest trends or if you are new to the area but wants a solid foundation based on a combination of theory and practice.

Participants in the course will be a mixture of professionals and students. To ensure exclusivity for you as employee and your employer, with support before, during and after the course, the number of professional participants is limited to 10. The minimum of participants is 3.

CO-CREATING COMPETENCE DEVELOPMENT

The course itself run during 10 weeks but in fact the most important elements for a successful use of the training is the preparation prior to course start combined with the follow-up afterwards.

As shown in the picture (you can download the picture for best performance) the first important milestone. This is an occasion where a representative of the organisation (e.g. managers of participant/ HR responsible etc.) takes part in a preparation event together with their participants and course teachers to set objectives for the training and discuss how the organisation plans to make use of the newly acquired competencies afterwards.

 Day will be provided for a digital meeting for managers of participant/ HR responsible about the course and co-creating competence development

As organisational impact is a main objective the participants are also offered three post-training coaching sessions focusing on how to support the practical implementation of the acquired competencies in the home organisation. Finally, one year after completed training a post training evaluation of benefits is offered using infographics to capture learning in a way that is easy to illustrate and share.

WHY A TAILORMADE PROJECT MANAGEMENT TRAINING MATTERS?

Any organisation investing in training would be looking for organisational impact and thus be interested in a training tailormade for their own needs. This presupposes that they are clear about what their own needs are in a world with an accelerating speed of change. Therefore, we have designed a course aiming for a black belt in as many project management disciplines as possible, where participants are also exchanging experiences between different industries to ensure that they have as many toolboxes and examples as possible to draw from, before they bring new input to their home organisation. Ideally the home organisation is ready and eager to welcome the training participant back as a potential change agent that can bring a fresh perspective on current practices and hopefully could be given space to suggest and try out something new and different.

THE AIM OF THE COURSE

Karlstad Business School offers Project management 4.0 as a tailormade entry towards the future way of managing projects.

You get access to international guest lecturers, which consists of a mix of academics and professionals with in-depth knowledge of project management as well as the opportunity to tailor the education based on your and your employer's needs.

Project management 4.0 is implemented remotely via Zoom and uses the collaboration platforms Padlet and Canvas. Lectures takes place in the evening enabling e.g, compatibility with a full-time job. As a participant, you are expected to be able to participate in scheduled group meetings in the evenings and / or during weekends.

- This course gives you everything you need to know about the latest trends in project management, says Erik Månsson, course leader. The strength of the course structure is that it enables you as a participant to complete the education regardless of where you are in the world, and at the same time getting access to the qualified knowledge we offer.

The aim of the course is to provide both a theoretical as well as a practical foundation for managing any type of project such as traditional sequential (waterfall), agile or hybrid projects. The uniqueness of the course is the link to the evolution of project managing by introducing participants to benefits and challenges of each level of project management from 1.0 (top down hierarchical) towards 4.0 (ecosystem) in the making. This holistic view on project management enables participants to understand what the optimal response to any project context is.

The course itself is run as an example of project management 4.0 including a pre-project phase in Q1 2023 where the individual course objectives are discussed in dialogue between the participant, his/her organisation and the lecturer. During the course itself (project phase) participants form virtual project teams that will deliver a number of projects in a role play with a project owner based on cases where actual and virtual reality merge. Finally, all stakeholders involved will be engaged in a post project evaluation phase to ensure that lessons learned are used for continuous improvement loops.

COURSE CONTENT

The course includes virtual meetings, coaching and follow-up discussion of individual projects from the perspective of the project manager. There is a focus on projects in different professional contexts. Special emphasis is placed on project delimitation and

the planning, organisation, and completion of individual projects, as well as the interaction between the project managers and other managers in the organisation where the project is carried out.

The coursework is characterised to a great extent by participants being responsible for working actively in groups with authentic cases.

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to

- describe projects as goal-oriented work,
- describe, identify, and use relevant tools and methods to organise, plan, and manage individual projects, taking into account the specificity of each project,
- understand the evolution of project management from 1.0 (hierarchical) towards
 4.0 (eco system) to be able to determine pros and cons for each level, and map it to own organisation and context.

Module 1: General project management

Introduction lecture by teachers Erik Månsson and John Johansson together with guest lecturer Bo Tonnquist who introduces his book Project Management followed by a workshop.

Module 2: Agile project management

Guest lecture by Dr. Tomas Gustavsson who introduces his book Agile Project Management followed by a workshop

Module 3: Project Governance

Guest lecture by Rolf Berndtson who introduces his book "Invest in Projects" followed by a workshop on the role of the project steering group

Module 4: Introduction of project case study 1

The course teachers Erik Månsson and John Johansson introduces the first case study on which participants will work and deliver a project plan as part of an assigned project team

Module 5: Project objectives and stakeholder management

Guest lecture and workshop with Karin Appelgren who is also offering Q&A on the topics

Module 6: Risk, resources, requirements and time

Guest lecture and workshop with Karin Appelgren who is also offering Q&A on the topics

Module 7: Introduction of project case 2 & 3

The course teachers Erik Månsson and John Johansson introduces project case 2 and 3 on which participants will work and deliver project plans as part of an assigned project team

Module 8: Group seminar on case 2 and 3 (mandatory)

Participants will present their project plans for case 2 and 3 as part of their assigned project team

Module 9: Final group seminar (manadatory)

EXAMINATION

The course is at undergraduate level and you can choose to accomplish the exam for 7,5 ECTS.

Assessment is based on individual written on-line exams, written hand-in group assignments, and active participation in group exercises and seminars.

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.

Upon request you may apply for an individually tailored exam where you will reflect on the course content in the context of your own work environment, and with the possibility to agree on the examination form and period (e.g. linked to the coaching sessions that will be offered between end of the course in June and end of the year or having the possibility to write your answers in Swedish instead of English).

COST

The course fee is 23 600 SEK (approximately 1. 850 €) excl. VAT per person (2024). Early bird registration with discount is 19 800 SEK (approximately 1. 560 €) if you register at the latest by 15 December 2023. Compulsory literature are not included in the fee

VAT: Swedish VAT, 25%, will be charged on the course fee for all foreign or Swedish participants except for Swedish governmental organisations.

TERMS OF REGISTRATION

Commissioned education is conducted in accordance with its regulations and turn to employees in the public sector, authorities and companies. To register for a commissioned education you have to be employed at a company or organization (not sole proprietorship). You can not participate as a private person. When you register your employer has to approve to your participation and will agree to receive an invoice for the costs of the education. The registration is binding and can not be cancelled. If the number of participants becomes too low we might have to cancel the education. In that case we let you know as soon as possible.
