



MIRAI 3.0 (2024-2026) is a collaborative project with 17 Swedish and Japanese universities aiming to strength the collaboration within education, research and innovation. The main goal is to increase the collaboration over the different areas and sectors which are vital for addressing the society challenges such as climate crisis, pandemic and the elderly society.

MIRAI 3.0 will work by interdisciplinary teams with focus to the following Global Challenges:

- **Challenge 1:** Health and an ageing population: inclusive digital care, intergenerational relations, sociotechnical innovation, older people's involvement as agents of change (10 KaU senior researchers)
- **Challenge 2:** Climate adaption, disaster and risk management and prevention (9 KaU senior researchers)
- **Challenge 3:** Resilient cities and communities – policies, strategies, local government and urban planning (5 KaU senior researchers)
- **Challenge 4:** Materials for Energy Conversion and Storage: renewable energy, solar energy conversion, electrification, sustainable processes and use of resources (18 KaU senior researchers)
