Perilous Inquiry

An International Symposium on the Shrinking Space of Academic Freedom

Karlstad University, Sweden 4 – 5 June, 2025

Threats to free inquiry and scholarly independence appear to be multiplying. Whether from university administrations, academic colleagues, external funders, or—increasingly—illiberal governments and media, researchers face mounting challenges to their efforts to gain insights about the world.

We convene this symposium to examine these challenges more closely. Recognizing that threats to inquiry have various political agendas and technical mechanisms, we have called for a diverse range of scholarly analyses. Papers centre on limited case studies or broader structural phenomena; they investigate the research process holistically or highlight one of its component stages (developing projects, collecting data, and communicating results); they focus on a scholar's personal experience or they rely on observation; and we have welcomed, too, projects that critically explore the ideological underpinnings of scholarly independence. We intend for this exchange to help support scholarly activity and to uncover the roles that scholars can play in building open and more informed societies.
